Rejoice! Today is still sometimes called Gaudete Sunday because the first word of the entrance antiphon in Latin is gaudete, which means “rejoice”. It is taken from Philippians 4:4, Paul’s warm and loving letter to the community he founded in Philippi. The rose coloured candle on the wreath announces a change in our mood – anticipation builds; the season of waiting nears its end. For the student who’s pulling long hours studying and all-nighters still finishing late papers, this is anticipatory good news indeed!

Though at times in its history the Church considered Advent a more penitential time, today we see it as “a season of joyful and spiritual expectation” (GNLYC 39). It’s a good time to take note of our spiritual practices so far this year. One’s prayer life can easily be left at the bottom of the pile of the seemingly never-ending list of things that need to be done.

Jesuit Connection:

The Canadian Canoe Pilgrimage 2017 is a project of the Jesuits in English Canada, that wishes to promote reconciliation between the First Nations, French, and English peoples of Canada.



The paddlers will consist of Jesuits from both the French and English Provinces as well as First Nations Peoples and Jesuit collaborators (that’s lay people and non-Jesuits who have a connection with them).

By including representatives of French and English Canada and the First Nations, this pilgrimage will echo the original route made by St. Jean de Brébeuf and other Jesuits alongside the First Nations and Voyageurs in Canada’s formative years.
