**CHAPEL CONFIGURATION FOR LENT:**

By the solemn forty days of Lent the Church unites herself each year to the mystery of Jesus in the desert (CCC 540). When we gather on Sunday, we sometimes forget that there are two Tables:

THE TABLE OF THE WORD	THE TABLE OF THE EUCHARIST
• Nourishes us spiritually by God's Word	• Nourishes us spiritually by the Eucharist
• Helps us grow in wisdom	• Helps us grow in holiness
• Announces the divine covenant	• Renews the everlasting covenant
• Brings to mind the history of salvation	• Embodies the history of salvation in the sacramental signs of the liturgy

The configuration of the chapel during this Lent lends itself to a purposeful posture of our community as we sit to listen to God's word, and then gather around the altar to participate in the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

- Please find empty chairs in which to sit and use the benches only when the seats have all been occupied.
- Follow the gift bearers and gather around the altar for the Liturgy of the Eucharist.
- Please remain standing throughout the Eucharistic Prayer (paragraph 43 of the GIRM) and make a profound bow when the priest genuflects
- For the sake of uniformity of posture, indicating unity of the community, please remain standing throughout the Liturgy of the Eucharist, until the Prayer After Communion.

### WOMEN AT THE HEART OF CHANGE HELEN KELLER (1880–1968)

#### Witness to the Human Spirit

Helen Keller lost her sight and hearing when she was not quite 2 years old, and remained that way for her entire life.

With the guidance of a personal teacher, she eventually learned to understand speech by touching the throat, mouth and nose of the speaker and feeling the vibrations. She also learned to read Braille and to type on both Braille and standard typewriters.

When she graduated from Radcliffe in 1905, she became the first deaf-blind person to earn a B.A. and later learned to communicate to entire audiences verbally through her teacher, Anne Sullivan, and other close companions.

Keller toured as a lecturer and vaudeville performer. She also became active in politics because of her concern for the blind. Her concern for others was expressed through her support for socialist causes, her active campaigning for women's rights and workers' rights, and in her writing.
