Movie — Ignacio de Loyola

'If you could hear the voice of God, would you want to keep it secret?' This movie is a historical drama based on the memoirs of St. Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the Jesuits. It is the story of a soldier, a man of vice and violence who, in his attempt to turn to the light, was forced to wrestle with his inner demons to the very brink of death. The film chronicles his valiant but futile defense at the Battle of Pamplona, his struggles with depression and near-suicide, his trial before the Inquisition, and his ultimate vindication.

JVC is a faith-based and holistic year-long program where volunteers work with and be of service to the poor in order to learn about poverty from the "ground up." JVs are placed in a low income neighbourhood where they live in solidarity with the people that they serve. JVs are challenged to live simply in community, to grow spiritually, and to work for social and eco justice.
