Yesterday, November 5th, was the Feast of All Saints and Blesseds of the Society of Jesus. According to www.livingspace.sacredspace.ie, following on the celebration of All Saints, this feast honours the Jesuits who are with God in glory:

- 42 canonized saints; 131 blesseds; 36 venerables; and many others, who, in the faithful fulfilment of their calling in the Society of Jesus, are now face to face with their Lord in unending happiness.

This celebration calls to mind the power of God shining through human weakness and the reward given to those who, in the words of the Spiritual Exercises, “faithfully labour under the banner of Christ’s cross”.



Campion College has the distinct honour of being the only undergraduate Jesuit educational institution in Canada.

On December 1st, the feast of St. Edmund Campion, we will begin to celebrate our 100th year.

Jesuit institutions are recognized internationally for their high academic standards. The Jesuit philosophy of education centres on providing an atmosphere of open inquiry that unites rigorous scholarship and academic excellence with ethical values and service to others. This week we look at the second of four key characteristics of a Jesuit education.

Care for the Whole Person (*cura personalis*)

Cura personalis aims at the development of the whole person—intellectually, spiritually, physically, and socially—

while paying particular attention to the needs of the person. It manifests itself in the person who develops his/her gifts in service for others and demonstrates an ability to bring out the best in everyone.

Movie — Ignacio de Loyola

'If you could hear the voice of God, would you want to keep it secret?' This movie is a historical drama based on the memoirs of St. Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the Jesuits. It is the story of a soldier, a man of vice and violence who, in his attempt to turn to the light, was forced to wrestle with his inner demons to the very brink of death. The film chronicles his valiant but futile defense at the Battle of Pamplona, his struggles with depression and near-suicide, his trial before the Inquisition, and his ultimate vindication.

It will be shown in the Riffel Auditorium at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, November 24th. Tickets are \$8 each, but any students wishing to attend can be sponsored through Campus Ministry.
