World Religion Day/World Day of Migrants and Refugees

Today is World Religion Day. Pope Francis has said that Inter-religious dialogue must be grounded in a "full and forthright presentation of different faiths' respective convictions." Today is also the World Day of Migrants and Refugees, observed in many places in solidarity with the World Refugee Day promoted by the United Nations.

"The phenomenon of migration today is a providential opportunity for the proclamation of the Gospel in the contemporary world" (Pope Benedict XVI, 2012). As our world's refugees struggle because of political, religious, cultural, and personal exclusion, let's work and pray for an end to xenophobia and all forms of discrimination against migrants and refugees.

Between January 18th and 25th we celebrate a universal week of prayer for Christian unity. Christians of all denominations are encouraged to meet, to participate in various community and liturgical activities, and to pray together that all may be one, as Christ desires. "Reconciliation" is this year's theme.
