## Blanket Exercise

Do you want to learn more about the historic and contemporary relationship between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples in Canada? This is an excellent opportunity for staff, students, and faculty to learn about reconciliation.

Done as a simulation, the Blanket Exercise covers over 500 years and teaches Indigenous history through hands-on exploration in 2 ½ hours. The Exercise was developed in response to the 1996 Report of the Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples, which recommended education on Canadian-Indigenous history as one of the key steps to learning truth and reconciliation.
