Jesuit Connection:

The Canadian Canoe Pilgrimage 2017 is a project of the Jesuits in English Canada, that wishes to promote reconciliation between the First Nations, French, and English peoples of Canada.



The paddlers will consist of Jesuits from both the French and English Provinces as well as First Nations Peoples and Jesuit collaborators (that's lay people and non-Jesuits who have a connection with them).

By including representatives of French and English Canada and the First Nations, this pilgrimage will echo the original route made by St. Jean de Brébeuf and other Jesuits alongside the First Nations and Ojageurs in Canada's formative years.
