#### Countdown to Lent







Lent begins on March 1st with the 12:30 p.m. Ash Wednesday mass and distribution of ashes. Before we get there, though, we should start asking ourselves some questions and we should start with some preparations. "What does God want of me this year?" This question may require that I slow down a bit and *listen* to my inner spirit. Start thinking **now** about how you will prepare.

Do you know that the ashes that are used to mark the beginning of Lent come from the branches that were blessed and distributed last Palm Sunday? If you have last year's palms that you would like to bring in, they will again be burned for this year's ashes. Just leave them in the container near the back of the chapel. Thank you.

## From Conflict to Communion





Every Friday throughout the semester the CCSU team will be posting a topic or theme on their Facebook page or door (CM110). Students have the option of submitting:


- an essay (between 500-1000 words max)


