This Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. Here are a few reminders you may appreciate for the upcoming week:

- Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence from meat
- Fridays are also days of abstinence from meat, but Catholics may substitute special acts of charity or piety on this day
- Abstinence from meat applies to those who are 14 years of age and older
- Fasting applies to those who are 18 to 59 (unless medically unable)

Lent has a penitential character, with special attention placed on the teachings of the Gospels (fasting, almsgiving, prayer, works of justice and mercy). How will you engage in a special way with some of the things that are being offered this Lent? Here are some suggestions from Campus Ministry for these first few days:

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- Bring a friend to a daily or Sunday liturgy in the chapel
  - Participate in a student retreat
  - Read the Sunday (or weekday) scriptures prior to liturgy
  - Spend time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament

- Remember Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence
  - Fast from electronic screens for a portion of each day
  - Fast from criticizing, complaining, feeling down on yourself
  - Fast from isolation and smile at at least one person you don't know each day

Participate in the Development and Peace Share Lent **Solidarity Calendar**. Each year there is a different focus to the campaign.
