Jesuit Connection — General Congregation 36



Since October 2nd, the Jesuits have been meeting in Rome for GC 36. In the 476 years since its founding, the Society of Jesus has convened only 35 prior general congregations. One is always called on the death or resignation of the head of the Society — the Superior General — to choose his

successor, or when the General decides action is needed on serious matters that he cannot or does not want to decide alone.

The current Superior General of the Society of Jesus, Father Adolfo Nicolás, SJ, a native of Spain, announced in December of 2014 his intention to resign. Fr. Nicolás was elected in 2008 to succeed Father Peter-Hans Kolvenbach, SJ. This General Congregation will discern Fr. Nicolás successor.
